

Application for Admission Prairie Horticulture Certificate (PHC) Program

Admission

Applications for admission are accepted for the PHC program only. If you wish to enrol in a degree credit course, you must follow the general admission procedures outlined at **usask.ca/admission**.

You must be admitted to the PHC program, before you will be able to register for classes, even if you are a previous U of S student. Please note the admission deadlines listed at **phc.usask.ca**.

Previous U of S students are not required to pay the \$75.00 application fee, nor submit education transcripts, if course work was completed and a grade obtained at the U of S.

Admission Categories and Educational Requirements

Regular Admission

This category is for applicants who have completed secondary level standing (24 credits) in Saskatchewan, or its equivalent, and for applicants who have previously or are currently attending another recognized post-secondary institution. GED, ABE, and ACE subjects are not acceptable for regular admission. Saskatchewan Grade 12 transcripts must be requested at www.saskatchewan.ca. For transcripts from other provinces, contact the Provincial Department of Education.

Probationary Admission

This category is for those who do not qualify for regular admission. Applicants for probationary admission must submit transcripts for any Grade 12, or equivalent subjects, or transcripts of any courses at a recognized post-secondary institution. ABE 12 courses will be acceptable for this purpose. A resume must also be submitted.

Students admitted on a probationary basis can register in one per course per term. If students successfully pass two courses with an average mark of 60% or better, they will deemed to have met the regular admission requirements.

Required Admission Documentation

In addition to the completed admission form, the following documents and fees are required for admission. Please note that the application fee and transcripts requirement are for new U of S students only.

- Application Fee (\$75)
- Transcripts (high school or post-secondary)
- Proof of English Proficiency (for applicants whose first language is not English)
- Copy of both sides of Permanent Residence Card (if applying as a landed immigrant)
